## Wound Dressing Decision Chart

<u>Remember</u> - Diabetic Foot Ulcers: Refer to the Multi-Disciplinary Foot Care Team – Tel: 0300 123 3659, Email: <u>whcnhs.worcestershiremdft@nhs.net</u>, please keep dry until assessment, use Inadine if appropriate.

- Keep the following wounds dry: intact necrotic areas on heels, diabetic foot ulcers and wounds caused by Peripheral Vascular Disease

When to swab - Where there are clinical signs of infection e.g. pain, heat, exudate, odour

- Where the wound is deteriorating e.g. sudden increase in pain and/or bleeding in the wound bed
