## **Face Fit Awareness**

3. Check

Please ensure that you follow these six steps to fit your respirator correctly:

2. Don

#### 1. Prepare



Hold the respirator and separate the edges to fully open it. Bend the nose wire in the centre at the top to form a gentle curve.

#### 5. Fit Check



Cover the front of the respirator with both hands. For an unvalved product exhale sharply, for a valved product inhale sharply. A successful fit check is where there is no air leaking from the edges of the respirator. Remove the mask by holding the straps and lifting them over

of your head below your ears

and the upper headband on the

crown on the top of your head

above the ears

6. Dispose

your head, then dispose of the mask. Do not touch the mask – it may be contaminated.

Ensure that the respirator is flat against your cheeks and under your chin, if not then reposition the straps until you achieve a good fit.



Mould the nosepiece across the bridge of your nose by firmly pressing down with your fingers until you have a good seal.
