Stroke specialist physiotherapists will keep knowledge and skills, in stroke rehabilitation, updated through continuing professional development (evidence based practice, reflection, training/attendance on courses)

Stroke specialist physiotherapists will develop junior physiotherapists, within the stroke team, on effective assessment, positioning and handling of stroke patients. They will complete the standardised, rotational training with junior physiotherapists and each will have an individual Personal Development Review. All healthcare professionals, within the stroke team, have a responsibility to maintain competencies in stroke mobilisation/rehabilitation. The physiotherapists are committed to the implementation of a rolling programme of training for the multi-disciplinary team, which includes positioning and handling of stroke patients. The physiotherapy assistants have competency based training in stroke rehabilitation.
